Job description: We seek a spiritual leader to provide religious, educational, and pastoral leadership to the Jewish community of Temple Beth Shalom, which serves Melrose, MA and surrounding communities.

Vision statement

Temple Beth Shalom (TBS) of Melrose, Massachusetts is a small, welcoming, and inclusive Reform synagogue founded in 1950. We seek to cultivate joyful and meaningful Jewish practice through ritual, culture, and learning. We aim to foster *Tikkun Olam* within our Jewish community and the community-at-large. We dedicate ourselves to expanding life-long learning opportunities and building the next generation of Jews. Mutually supportive and tightly knit, our temple family encourages participation by all who seek a connection to Jewish life.

A word about our community

Our synagogue is located seven miles from Boston in dynamic Melrose, MA. With a strong core of long-time members and a growing cohort of families with young children, our community of more than 85 families is well-respected in the city for the programs it provides and offers fertile ground for ongoing growth. TBS families reflect a diversity of races, genders, and sexual orientations. Our members come from and keep many levels of Jewish and non-Jewish religious observance. We are proud of the role non-Jewish members of our interfaith families play in temple life and leadership. Many of our members are actively engaged in our local community and especially in social justice work.

Founded in 1988, our religious school provides education to children from pre-K through seventh grade. While the school has had over 50 students in the past, current enrollment is around 30 students. With the recent influx of young families with children to Melrose, we expect our school to grow over the next few years.

Position Overview

Our congregation has been served by a part-time rabbi for its entire history. In recent years, the role of the Head of the Religious School has been enhanced and professionalized. At this time, we are seeking to combine both roles into a single, full-time rabbinic position.

Rabbinic Responsibilities

- Provide religious leadership and pastoral care to TBS members. Inspire, challenge, and encourage all members in their Jewish knowledge, understanding, beliefs, and practices

- Help community members navigate the complexity of modern life by making Jewish values and texts relevant to the important issues of today

- Lead the TBS Shalom School, in part by maintaining the welcoming and creative environment that has enabled the younger members of our congregation to learn the values, traditions, and practices that unite us with the Jewish people as a whole

- Inspire and enhance Jewish learning and knowledge to support ritual observance of community members

- Incorporate a creative approach in TBS services, programs, education and community outreach to enhance and expand member participation

Religious

- Lead and coordinate services that are musically engaging, meaningful, inclusive, and encourage participation in services by community members of all ages

- Deliver sermons that inspire, educate, and are thought-provoking and/or challenge members of the congregation to learn, reflect and grow spiritually and religiously

- Lead programs aimed at families with young children
